

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
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Zhaoqing, Guangdong, China

Spectacular natural heritage along the trail

The Seven Star Crags, one of China's top 100 tourist attractions, is a city of ancient history and culture. It is China's first nature protection district. The City of Zhaoqing where the biosphere reserve Dinghu Mountain is situated is full of charm and attraction. It is a great place for a full-day tour, about a 3-4 hour distance from Guangzhou and Hong Kong.


The City of Zhaoqing which governs four counties, two cities and two districts is situated in Guangdong Province. It is a hub of water transportation from Guangzhou to Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous District. Thanks to a subtropical monsoon climate, there are a lot of green mountains and trees in Zhaoqing. With breathtaking natural landscape, this city has a rich valuable cultural heritage with assets like the Seven Star Crags and Dinghu Mountain. It is also fun to visit historic and cultural attractions which can be over 2,000 years old and take a glimpse of the lives of people from over 39 different ethnic groups.

PICTURESOUE SEVEN STAR CRAGS AND XINGHU

The Seven Star Crags and Xinghu which are as huge as 100,000km² in total area (60,000km² for the lake) are the highlight of a trip to Zhaoqing. A levee which connects the four big lakes is a romantic spot to take a walk early in the morning or in the evening. The Seven Star Crags refers to seven big crags which are located in the center in each of the four lakes. Each crag has its own name. The seven crags which stand tall in the lake will remind you of the Great Bar Constellation. That's how The 'Seven Star Crags' got its name. The picture of the Seven Star Crags on the ticket has an image of a Buddha lying down. It's been said that the night falls into the mouth of the Buddhist statue once a year.

To have a better view of this tourist spot, you need to hike up to the peak. Once you arrive at Tianzhufeng Rock in the middle of the seven crags, you can get a complete view of the beautiful lakes. If the weather is good, you can see the City of Zhaoqing as well. It is still chilly in the 8 caves of Zhaoqing even during the hot summer so they become crowded with a lot of tourists from July to September. A lot of poetry and prose written in red are found on the walls of the caves. The caves are so wide that it's a good idea to go on a tour by bus or by boat.

DUANZHOU INKSTONE, SPECIALTY OF ZHAOQING

If you have to buy just one souvenir in Zhaoqing, it would have to be an 'ink stone'. A Duanzhou ink stone from Zhaoqing is one of the top four ink stones of China. Duanzhou Inkstone refers to ink stones produced in Duanzhou east of Zhaoqing, in Lingyang Gorge, Xiaoxiang Gorge and Dinghu Mountain north of Seven Star Crags. It is called 'Duanzhou' or 'Duan inkstand'. Therefore, a lot of ink stone stores and factories are clustered there. You can also see people making ink stones in person. Duanzhou Inkstone is not just an ink stone, but a piece of art. Small ink stones are available for CNY 150~200 and large ones for over CNY 5,000.

ANTIQUE ARCHITECTURE OF ZHAOQING

Elegant and beautiful ancient buildings are lined along the Xi Jiang. For example, Yue Jiang Lou (River View Pavilion) was built during the Han Dynasty and remodeled in 1641. Now, it is open to the public as the Museum of History of the Chinese Revolution. There is a 58m-tall Chongxi Pagoda which was built in 1582, about a 15-minute distance from Yue Jiang Lou. You can enter into the 9-story octagonal pagoda. Don't miss catching the great view of Xi Jiang River from the observation tower. There are many western-style buildings around the pagoda. It's been said that priest Matteo Ricci once lived there

DINGHU MOUNTAIN - ONE OF THE TOP FOUR NOTED MOUNTAINS OF GUANGDONG!

Mountain Dinghu was nominated as a Biosphere Reserve for the first time in China. It is one of the top four noted mountains of Guangdong. You will be stunned by the beauty of a 400-year-old primeval forest. There are established trails in most areas along the valley. From the entrance, you can meet Longtan waterfall, Sky Lake, Valley of the Butterfly and Virgin forest. Once you arrive at Qingyun Temple, you need to hike up 3 more hours to get to the entrance of the park. A great amount of negatively charged ions in the air will make you feel pleasant and refreshed. At the peak, huge iron potand ink stone-shaped sculptures welcome you.

INTIMATE BAGUA VILLAGE

This village is well-designed with many small houses. In every path, a temple and a private house stand next to each other with a wall between them. This village is about 40km away from downtown Zhaoqing. It is recommended to take a taxi to visit here. It will take 1 or 2 hours to tour around the village. The official name of this village is Gaoyao Huilong Li Cha village. This village is often compared to Zhuge Bagua Village in Jinhua City, Zhejiang Province. However, this friendly village is less commercially developed and warmly welcomes visitors.

Thinking of Ocean

Japan is made up of many islands yet you can always discover more new aspects of the sea as you travel through. Shimonoseki is the harbor city of Yamaguchi prepecture, where you can find the powerful yet very serene ocean. Shimonoseki is the place where you can actually witness, listen and taste the ocean. The stretched out Kanmon bridge is an important link that connects Honshu and Kyushu. The ships that cross that area can enjoy the serene view of the ocean. Shimonoseki has everything an ocean could offer.

EVER-CHANGING LIGHT OF OCEAN

KAIKYO YUME TOWER

Have the whole ocean at one gaze. Kaikyo Yume tower is the true landmark of Shimoneseki with its 143 meter height and highly sophisticated design. It is the tallest tower in the city, and once you step into the glass elevator to go up to the round-shaped observatory, you can have the whole view of Kanmon strait between Honshu and Kyushu. The ever changing light and shadow of the ocean glow like some crystal throughout the day. The tower is the power of the international exhibition and conference facility, Shimonoseki Kaikyo messe. After the dusk, the tower is lighted with different lights every day, truly definding the night view. The whole scene truly materializes the meaning of the tower, 'Dream of Strait'.

LEGACY OF THE MARINE BATTLE AKAMA SHRINE

Akama Shrine is the place where the cherished and legendary marine battle took place a long time ago. This marine battle happened 820 years ago between two warrior groups, Heishi and Kenji, fighting for marine dominancy. They had their final battle at Dannoura that settled once and for all their destiny, near the Kanmon strait. After defeat, the Heishi warriors all committed suicide by plunging into the ocean, and Antoku King was the last emperor who was the owner of Akama Shrine. This shrine has a distinctive and charming design made of wood, painted with vivid red and pure white. and added with a green pond and stone-made towers the whole place resonates a very mysterious ambience. Originally, this was the place that provided lodging support for Chosun Tongshinsa (The embassy group to Japan), and we can still locate the monument for them at the park across the street. Inside the shrine, there is Shichimorizka, which hosts the Antoku tomb and Heishi groups. There is a festival that commemorates the marine battle, Senteisai, every May.

EXPLORE THE WORLD OF GREAT TASTES KARATO SEAFOOD MARKET

If you want to be truly adventurous and explore all the tastes of Shimonoseki, go to Karato seafood market. This is the place where the best local chefs come to get the best seafood. You can also witness the lively auctions. There is such a variety of seafood such as fugu, sea urchins, ear shells and fish cakes, but the most popular dishes include Fugu fish. Shimonoseki heavily consumes a lot of Fugu, and there is a Fugu festival every February.

There are various dishes made with Fugu-stews, French fries and even wines made out of Fugu fins! At the market, you pick and purchase seafood on the first floor, then dine in on the second floor. There are street vendors during weekday lunch time who sell fresh cooked food such as the very affordable and tasty 100 yen sushi which is highly popular. If you want to explore further, you can visit the nearby Sea Side Mall's Kamonwaf, where you can find high-end restaurants and souvenir shops.



You can do all this at Shimososeki Aquarium, or Shimonoseki Marine Science Museum. This place is the home of 15,000 sea creatures of more than 400 species including Fugu (more than 100 species), jelly fish, sharks, sea turtles, penguins, dolphins and others. The white whalebone is the first of its kind shown in Japan. This aquarium holds more than 2,400 tons of sea water in 65 water tanks with very a the impressive Agua Theater which is built along Kanmon strait. There is an animal show with sea leopards and dolphins. Visitors can also see when the sea leopards and penguins are being fed.



EXPLORATION OF MOUNTAINS AND THE SEA

Danang is a port city in which nature and a modern city coexist in harmony.
During the Vietnam War, the biggest U.S. army base was stationed here. Now, this city is reputed to be the best tourist attraction in the central region of Vietnam surrounded by the beautiful ocean and thick forest with a beautiful river which flows through the city.



GIGANTIC MARBLE MOUNTAINS

NGU HANH SON (MARBLE MOUNTAINS)

The entire mountain range is formed with marble. In the beginning, it was the holy land of Hinduism. Now, it is the sacred ground of Buddhism. The locals worship the mountains. The mountains consist of five peaks named 'Moc Son (literally 'wood'), Kim Son ('metal'), Tho Son ('earth'), Hoa Son ('fire') and Thuy Son ('water'). Thuy Son is an observatory from which you can see the all the Marble Mountains. Here, there are many natural limestone caves and temples. If you want to tour the cave, you need to bring a flashlight. Once you arrive at the peak, you can get a complete view of the village and meet a variety of fascinating antique temples. In the village, there are many studios where you can see how marble products are made in person. You can even buy one of them if you want.

CABLE CAR LISTED IN THE GUINNESS BOOK OF RECORDS BÁ NÁ HILLS

The cable car in Bá Ná Hills, a landmark of Danang, is listed in the Guinness Book of Records with the longest distance (5042.62m) and the highest altitude (1291.81m above sea level). In terms of temperature, the annual mean temperature ranges from 17 to 20 $^{\circ}$ C. If you arrive at the peak, cool and refreshing winds will make you feel relaxed. If you get on the

cable car, you can see beautiful tropical forests and valleys and spectacular waterfalls during the 15-minute trip. Since March 2009, the number of visitors has gradually increased. In terms of accommodations, there are five hotels (Morin, L'Indochine, Debay, L'Jardin and Hoa Rừng) space and one vacation villa (Biệt thự Hoàng Lan). In addition, a small amusement park has been popular among tourists with children. The cable car is available in two lines. You can tour around the gigantic Buddhist statue (27m-tall) 'Chùa Linh Úng', Tien Waterfall (Thác Tóc Tiên) and the ancient French village (Khu Làng Pháp).



LOVELY BEACH THROUGHOUT ALL SEASONS!

DA NANG BEACH

Da Nang Beach is divided into Da Nang Bay, Son Tra and East Sea. Da Nang Bay is the northern part of Da Nang Beach. It is also divided into Nam O, Xuan Thieu and Thanh Binh. The 12km-long beach is adjacent to the coastal drive. Here, you can see a bridge which is connected with Song Han and the port. The most favorite beach for tourists is the East Sea. This 20km-long beach is always crowded with people from early morning until late at night. Luxurious deluxe resorts such as the five-star Furama Resort and the Sand Beach Resort are lined along the beach. In addition, other luxury resorts including Le Meridien and the Hyatt are under construction. Unlike the East Sea where there are only sand beaches, Son Tra has a thick forest. Six spectacular beaches (Tien Sa, Dong Hai, Bai But, Bai Rang, Bai Bac and Bai Nam) surround the peninsula. You can enjoy a variety of fun and exciting activities such as swimming, fishing, trekking and diving.



GREEN NATURE IN THE CITY

SON TRA PENINSULA

Son Tra Peninsula is a tropical rain forest (15km-long, 5km-wide, 4,370 ha) which is about 8km away from the downtown. It is a great place to see the beauty of the nature when getting away from hectic urban life. You can travel the mushroom-shaped 696m-tall peninsula in a car. Once you arrive at the peak, you can get a complete view of Danang Bay, the East Sea and the City of Danang. Under Linh Ung Temple where a 67m-tall white Buddhist statue and delicate sculptures are placed, there is Tien Sa Resort and a beautiful coastal drive

SHELTER FOR CITIZENS OF DANANG THE HAN RIVER

The Han River which flows through the middle of Danang City is a symbol of Danang and a shelter and playground for its people. As the sun sets in the evening, the colorful lighting



on the four bridges makes the river more romantic and beautiful. Among them, Son Han Bridge is the most beautiful. At night, you can see amusement park rides and street vendors around this bridge. You can take a pleasant walk along the promenade. In addition, cafés, clubs, hotels and restaurants are also lined along the river.



VIETNAM'S BEST DRIVE HAI VAN PASS

'Hai' and 'Van' mean 'the sea' and 'cloud' respectively in Vietnamese. Hai Van literally means 'cloudy coastal hill.' Even though there is no particular tourist attraction on this 600m-tall hill, it has a great view of mountains and the open ocean from its peak. From this hill, temperature differs greatly between the south and the north. In the center of this mountain pass, you can see the deep political divisions between the north and south of the past as well. This pass was a strategic spot during the Vietnam War. At the peak, Saigon's bunker still remains. You can see a lot of bullet holes on the walls of the bunker.

HISTORY TOUR

The history of Danang is full of ups and downs.
During the 12th-15th century, Danang was a Cham tribe village. During the French colonial period, it was a major port of Vietnam in the central region along with Hoi An.
During the Vietnam War, this city was the U.S. army base. Just like its history, Danang has a lot of fun and exciting tourist attractions.



ALL RELIGIONS ARE ONE

CAO DAI TEMPLE

In Cao Dai Temple, you can meet the All-Seeing Eye which may remind you of the Japanese cartoon '20th Century Boy.' The Eye of God symbolizes the all-knowing and everpresent God. This new religion was formed in the early 1910s. It sees the top five religions (Buddhism, Christianity, Islam, Confucianism and Taoism) as one. Therefore, you can see some deities of other religions in this temple. Service is held four times a day (05:30, 11:30 17:30 and 23:30).





ROMANTIC PINK ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH CHINH TOA DA NANG

Chinh Toa Da Nang is a Roman Catholic church built by the French in 1923. This European-style building has elaborate ornaments and elegant and refined design in romantic pink color. This magnificent building is crowded with followers on weekends. When there is no mass, enter the building through the narrow street behind as the front gate will be closed.

LOVELY AND INFORMATIVE MUSEUM

BAO TANG CHAM (CHAM SCULPTURE MUSEUM)

Bao Tang Cham (Cham Sculpture Museum) is a must-visit tourist destination in Danang. A wide variety of sculptures from Cham Kingdom during the 4th-13th century are displayed. Cham Kingdom become so powerful that it took over the Kingdom of Angkor in Cambodia. This museum was



established by the East Asian Society by France in 1915. Approximately 300 artifacts are on display. They are mostly collected from Quang Nam. The exhibition halls are divided into nine eras. Most sculptures made of sandstone have a shape of Hindu deities such as iva, brahma, Viu and garuda.

TIME TRAVELING IN DAEGU

Travel Daegu by following the alleys where the stories and memories are stacked up, from Low hill where American missionaries lived, and the stairways holding the breath of the March 1st Independence Movement to the old house where the resistance national poet Lee, Sang Wha lived.



HILL WHERE THE MIND RESTS DONGSAN AND MEDICAL MISSIONS MUSEUM

"Dongsan" is the low hill located in downtown. While going up the gentle slope, you can see a red brick building covered with green ivy vines and an antique western-style garden. These old houses reminded in their current shape since the American missionaries started to live there in 1899. Three missionary houses were renovated to be used for the Medical Missions Museum. You can learn about the modern history and the architectural style at this place. It is quiet and peaceful. That makes this place a perfect meditation space in the city.

An exotic, red brick building appears in the center of downtown. Designed by the French and completed by Chinese builders, this building is the third Gothic style Catholic church built in Korea after Myeongdong Catholic Church in Seoul and Gwhanhoori Catholic



Church in Pyeongyang. Two spires and the rose-shaped window decorating the front of the church stand out. Waves of light generated by the colorful stained glass creates beauty. Look around the inside of the church! You can meet the first Catholic priest in Korea, Father Kim, Dae Geon, dressed in Hanbok designed on stained glass.

THE HISTORY ENGRAVED ON THE ROAD 3.1 INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT ROAD

On the declining slope from Dongsan to Kyesan Catholic church, there are about ninety stairs. During the 3/1 Independence Movement in 1919, students heading to the assembly place used these stairs to avoid Japanese police surveillance. It was like a secret path. If you walk these stairways thinking of the desperate situation of that time this peaceful view might be suddenly seen as

SIMPLICITY OF THE POET OLD HOUSE OF LEE, SANG WHA

National poet Lee, Sang Wha lived in this house until he died in 1943, two years before the independence of Korea. The house is a '¬' shaped Hanok divided into the main building and Sarang-Chae (men's part of the house). Persimmon trees,

pomegranate trees and well polished shiny crocks in the garden show the simple and harmonious beauty of nature. 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MORE APPROACHABLE SKY-ROAD, BUDGET AIRLINES

The airline ticket is the key factor that consumes a huge amount of money for your travel budget. The prices are set, so there isn't much difference no matter how hard and long you try to search for the cheapest ticket possible. However, here's good news for you if you've done a lot of searching to no avail. It's the low cost carrier, or LCC. They charge you for ticketing, baggage, food and seating, yet they will sell tickets for a 30 to 50% lower price. They widened the choices of airline tickets in terms of price in the market of lower price with limited service. The biggest difference between the LCCs and other carriers would be that you will have to pay for additional services such as blankets, refreshments or meals, which you get for free on other carriers. They charge for date changes, and may charge you some commission fees. However, some carriers may have a 'no refund' policy, so you should read the terms and conditions very carefully











before making any advance purchase. There are various newly established routes toward many Asia-Pacific destinations provided by low-cost carriers, and these airlines are increasing their market share rapidly. The biggest player is Air Asia, the largest LCC in the Asia-Pacific region. They operate routes that connect, Korea, Japan, Hong Kong, Chinese Taipei, Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand and others, adding up to 82 cities in 21 countries. The carry-on portable baggage limit is 7 kg, and the size of 115 m for all three dimensions together on the bag, one bag for one person. You maybe charged more if your baggage is heavier or larger than this. You can choose your own seat with extra payment if you do it one hour in advance of the departure time, and you can also choose to have an empty seat next to yours. If you book your meal in advance, you can get a 15% discount along with a free bottle of water, which means more money saved. Along with Air Asia, Jet Star is also another big player, rapidly expanding its domain in Asia.

Jet Star operates in 52 cities in 14 countries: Singapore, Philippines, Malaysia, Chinese Taipei, Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Hongkong, Thailand and others. Their basic policies are similar to Air Asia, but bear in mind that the ticket is not refundable. The date and time can be changed with extra payment, but the ticket is non-refundable, so you have to be extra careful when making a final purchase.

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CLICK! HOTEL BOOKING WEBSITE

Accommodation is the next item that consumes a lot of travel money. However, if you want to stay at a hotel rather than guest houses or hostels, you may want to book your room at hotel booking websites, as they have plenty of nice offers. They provide real-time hotel rates at discount prices ranging from affordable to first-class hotels. You can choose your own check-in time and date, and look at various photos of the room and also read through the candid reviews from fellow travelers who stayed at that hotel. They also have special recommendations for your need for special times such as Christmas, new years, summer vacation and others. These are









the venues where you can get the latest popular hotel and other detailed information. However, you will have to check the refund and cancellation policy just like for the low-cost carrier companies. They are hotel booking sites, so they sometimes dodge responsibility when there are confrontations between them and the customers. Also, if the hotel booking sites are based abroad, you may have a hard time communicating with them. As for the Expedia (www.expedia.com) which operates official local websites in 24 countries, they support hotel booking services for America, Canada, France, Australia, Korea, Japan, China, Singapore, Hong Kong, Vietnam, Chinese Taipei and many others, for 150,000 hotel networks in over 300,000 cities worldwide. Expedia provides not just hotel bookings but car rental, airline booking, and package tour services as well. There are 11 million more reviews from fellow travelers on hotels which will greatly help you in choosing the right hotel. You can also get a virtual tour service of the hotel that you're interested in along with weather forecasts and maps.

Expedia has a special offer for its users, which is 'the Low Cost Service Guarantee' policy. If you can find any lower rate than Expedia at any other service providers under the same conditions, Expedia will refund your money along with a discount coupon. This is surely one of the great websites where you can get heads-up information if you're planning for your accommodations in advance. Also, if you download Expedia app to your smart phone, you can find the nearest hotel available with GPS location activated. There are other hotel booking websites such as Hotels. com (www.hotels.com), Agoda (www.agoda.com), and Hotelnjoy (www.hotelnjoy.com).



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SMART HOTEL PASS

There are various travel passes for smart travelers. These travel passes are packed with great benefits that are only valid for a limited period. You can get an unlimited travel pass for public transportation or free admission to museums, historic sites and other key tourist attractions. These travel passes put together all essential key sites yet provide a wide array of discounts. However, there are two kinds of expiration date. You can count the first 24 hours from your initial use of the pass as one day, or sometimes, midnight counts as the first day of using the pass. You will have to check how they calculate the pass expiration period. However, all this would be in vain if you lose the pass, because they will not reissue it. You could pay more while you try to save your money. These travel passes are very much well organized in Europe, but many Asian countries are recently presenting various efficient travel passes. For Japan, there is the Kansai Thru Pass, which provides unlimited use of any transportation in the Kansai region as in Osaka, Kobe, Kyoto and other cities. Only foreign visitors can purchase this ticket, and you can use the bus, subway (excluding JR) and other methods of transportation. Also, you can get discounts for over 350 key tourist attractions around the region. You can get up to a 30% discount for





Himeji Castle, Kobe Port Tower, Osaka Castle and others, and up to 20% discounts for local hot springs such as the Arima hot spring. The pass costs 3,800 Yen for adults for a two-day pass, and a three-day pass is 5,000 Yen. You can purchase passes at the Kansai Thru Pass homepage (www.surutto.com). This pass is extremely useful because you don't need to repurchase the tickets or worry about payment whenever you transfer. Chinese Taipei offers a Youth Travel Card that offers a various range of discounts for key attractions, transportation, lodging, restaurants and etc. The discounts are offered at the National Palace Museum, Taipei Museum, 101 Observatory, Miramar Entertainment Park, Taipei-Kaohsiung Cruise Tour and others, and you could get up to a 15% discount for youth hostels. What is surprising is that this travel card is available for free, so you will not want to miss it. You can register for these cards at 13 airports including Taoyuan airport, train stations, subway stations, service centers and language centers at graduate schools.

PENANG, MALAYSIA

The 5th TPO Forum & Working-Level Meeting Successfully Held

The 5th TPO Forum & Working-Level Meeting was held in George Town, Penang, Malaysia from September 17 to 20, 2012. This year's forum, where more than 100 delegates from 24 member cities gathered, was held under the theme of "Protection and Development of World Cultural Heritage". TPO Secretary General Speaks at UNWTO Forum

TPO Secretary General Hwan-Myung Joo participated as a speaker in the 6th UNWTO/PATA Forum on Tourism Trends and Outlook which was held on October 11-13, 2012 in Guilin, China. Organized in collaboration with the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and People's



Government of Guilin of China, this year's Forum focused on collaboration and partnerships for destination promotion, product development, business enhancement, and innovation and sustainability in tourism. Based on 10-year's work experience as Secretary General of an international tourism organization with 70 member cities in the Asia Pacific region, Mr. Joo spoke informatively on "Cooperation between Cities in Destination Marketing", sharing TPO's experience on inter-city collaboration at the international level.

The 5th TPO forum and Working-level Meeting

Protecting World Heritage Through ECO TOUR



UNESCO and governments, private organizations and travel agencies from around the world were united together to conserve world heritage. As the number of tourists visiting world heritage sites continuously increases, a TPO forum and working-level meeting were held in George Town in Penang, Malaysia, with the attendance of about 100 people from 24 cities and 6 private organizations of TPO member countries to develop and systematically protect precious cultural heritage.

Under the topic of 'Protection and Development of World Heritage,' the 5th TPO forum and working-level meeting were held at Bayview Beach Resort in World Heritage city George Town in Penang, Malaysia, from October 17 to 20, 2012 to promote eco-tourism industry which protects world cultural heritage. Unlike previous forums, 'The Leaders' Roundtable Discussion' was held in this forum by inviting mayors and deputy mayors from member cities. In addition, this event provided an opportunity to promote exchange among member cities as well as to develop and protect world heritage. With the start of an opening ceremony in the morning on October 18, the forum began. The keynote speaker Peter Debrine from the UNESCO World Heritage Centre delivered a speech under the topic of

'World Heritage and Sustainable Tourism'.

As the number of tourists visiting world heritage sites around the globe increases, it has become essential to develop and protect the sites. UNESCO expressed that it intended to support this scheme in cooperation with the governments, private organizations and travel agencies from around the world and received applause from the audience. In the first session of the afternoon, Dr. Leong Yueh Kwong delivered a presentation on 'Malaysia's Eco-tourism' under the topic of 'Protection of Natural Resources and Eco-tourism'. The representatives of leading eco-tourism cities including Busan (Korea), Ipoh (Malaysia) and Tainan (Chinese Taipei) attended the meeting as a panel and introduced their







eco-tourism policy and events. In the evening, they attended a welcome reception and exchanged cultures. In the second session which was held in the morning of October 19 under the topic of 'Protection and Development of World Heritage and Tourism,' Dominic Galicia, architect of ISC20C in the Philippines, delivered a speech on 'the Enhancement of the Tourism Industry through the Development and Protection of World Heritage: Philippine Cases.' In this session as well, the representatives of the cities with many world heritage resources including Jeonju (Korea), Surabaya (Indonesia) and Penang (Malaysia) attended as a panel and introduced their world heritage resources and the policy to develop and protect them. In a case presentation, the representatives of Kota Kinabalu (Malaysia), Changwon (Korea) and Yogyakarta (Indonesia) introduced their success story in developing and protecting their tourist resources. In 'The TPO-Penang World Heritage Campaign' in the afternoon, a variety of fun and exciting events (ex: Giving trees, visits to the world heritage festival, etc.) were held in celebration of the creation of the first TPO Friendship Park. In the evening, 'The TPO Best Awards' and farewell reception were held. In the awards, 11 member cities and one private member won a prize in 10 categories. THE FIRST TPO FRIENDSHIP PARK IN THE CITY OF PENANG

On September 19, 2012, the first TPO Friendship Park finally opened in George Town, Penang, Malaysia. This park is the result of the efforts to promote exchange and cooperation between Penang and TPO member cities and enhance people's awareness of TPO. TPO Friendship Park (3,500m²) in Penang is surrounded by historic buildings such as E&O Hotel and Blue Mansion. This park will be open to the public and become a symbolic place to enhance people's awareness of TPO and member cities and increase cooperative relationship.

The opening ceremony was held with the attendance of the representatives of member cities – Gimhae (Korea), Jung-gu (Busan) and Kota Kinabalu (Malaysia) – including the mayor and deputy of Surabaya (Indonesia). They planted their city tree and attended a TPO symbol unveiling ceremony as well. TPO Friendship Park will be managed and operated by the Municipal Council of Penang Island. The number of TPO friendship parks will continue to increase as long as there is a demand for the park.
